JOURNAL ENTRY GRANTING
REQUEST TO LIFT SUSPENSION

On February 14, 2025, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”) conducted a conference hearing on the Request to Lift Suspension (“Request”) filed by Kimberly R. Yoo, D.C. (“Licensee”). Matthew Gaus, Deputy Litigation Counsel, appeared in person as counsel for Disciplinary Panel No. 35 (“the Panel”). Kimberly R. Yoo, D.C. appeared in person, *pro se*.

1. On or about June 12, 2009, Dr. Kimberley R. Yoo, D.C. (“Licensee”), was first issued a Kansas chiropractic license, No. 01-05265.

2. On or about February 15, 2023, the Board issued a Final Order (“2023 Final Order”) finding Licensee had not completed the Professional/Problem-Based Ethics (“PROBE”) Ethics and Boundaries program hosted by the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians (“CPEP”) or substantially similar program approved by the Board,

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CONFIDENTIAL The Final Order indefinitely suspended Dr. Yoo’s Kansas D.C. license until she successfully completes the PROBE course or substantially similar program approved by the Board.

3. On or about February 8, 2024, Licensee filed a Motion with the Board requesting the Board to approve a substitute ethics course in place of the PROBE course.

4. On or about May 13, 2024, the Board issued a Journal Entry Granting Licensee's Motion to Amend Final Order, which amended the Board's 2023 Final Order directing the then sitting Disciplinary Panel of the Board to review, evaluate, and grant or deny any requests by Licensee to substitute an alternate ethics course in place of the PROBE course. All other provisions of the 2023 Final Order were unchanged and remained in effect.

5. On or about September 19-21, 2024, Licensee successfully completed the PROBE course required **CONFIDENTIAL** and Licensee provided to the Board a certificate of completion from CPEP for the same.

6. On or about December 11, 2024, Licensee filed a Request to Lift Suspension.

7. On or about December 11, 2024, the Panel filed a Response to Request to Lift Suspension ("Response") in which the Panel indicated that it believed Licensee had fully complied with the terms of the February 15, 2023, Summary Order and had no objection to Licensee's request to terminate her suspension.

8. Upon review of Licensee's Request, the Panel's Response, the agency record, the applicable statutes and regulations, and the statements by the parties at hearing, the Board finds that Licensee has fully complied with the terms of the 2023 Final Order and amendments thereto.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Licensee's Request to Lift Suspension is **GRANTED**, and the suspension of Licensee's license to practice chiropractic in Kansas is **LIFTED**. This order does not obviate any application requirements that would otherwise be

required to reinstate Licensee's license to the extent her license was cancelled for failure to renew.
