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**FINAL ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR LICENSE**

NOW on this 11<sup>th</sup> day of April 2025, comes on for hearing the application of Renato Aller-Zumaeta, D.O. for a license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Kansas. Todd Hiatt, Litigation Counsel, appears in person and on behalf of Disciplinary Panel #40 (DP#40). Disciplinary Panel members are recused from deciding this matter. The Applicant, Renato Aller-Zumaeta, D.O. appears in person.

The Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (KSBHA), DENIES the application and FURTHER FINDS the following:

1. The Applicant submitted his application on October 8, 2024.
2. Applicant had been employed at the Saint Luke’s Physician Group and Primary Care Barry Road Clinic (St. Lukes) in Kansas City, Missouri where he practiced as a family medicine physician beginning November 1, 2016.
3. The Board filed the application as complete on February 25, 2025.
4. The application shows that in November of 2016, Saint Luke’s Physician Group and Primary Care Barry Road Clinic in Kansas City, Missouri, hired Applicant to practice family medicine. *Id.*, at p. 6.

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5. Applicant does not identify any anticipated place of employment or place of future practice in Kansas. *Id.* p. 3.
6. The Missouri Board of Registration for the Healing Arts (Missouri Board) received a complaint about Applicant that alleged Applicant committed unprofessional conduct by commission of sexual acts on a patient.
7. On June 5, 2024, the Missouri Administrative Hearing Commission Order suspended Applicant finding probable cause to suggest that Applicant's continued practice constituted a serious danger to the health, safety, or welfare of a patient or the public.
8. The Missouri Board found in part that Applicant had committed sexual misconduct on the patient identified in the complaint including contact during a recorded session where Applicant thrust himself on her, pulling the patient to the end of the exam table, "grinding" his groin against the patient's vaginal area and laying across her body.
9. Applicant committed unprofessional conduct by his commission of acts or an act of sexual abuse, misconduct, or other improper sexual contact that exploits the licensee/patient relationship.
10. DP #40 opposes grant of the application.

K.S.A. 65-2836(j) authorizes the Board to deny an Application in Kansas when the Applicant's license has been revoked or suspended by another State. The Missouri Board suspended applicant's license. K.S.A. 65-2837(a)(16) defines unprofessional conduct to include sexual abuse, misconduct, or other improper sexual contact that exploits the licensee-patient relationship. K.S.A. 65-2801 authorizes the Board to protect against unprofessional conduct. K.S.A. 65-2836(b) authorizes the Board to deny an application for unprofessional conduct.

WHEREFORE, the Board denies the application for unprofessional conduct and for having had his license suspended in the State of Missouri.  
IT IS SO ORDERED.
