FINAL ORDER

APPROVAL OF REQUEST TO ADD SECOND WORKSITE

On this 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 2025, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”) enters this Final Order. On December 1, 2025, Board Member Steven Gould, D.C., Presiding Officer, conducted a video electronic formal hearing in this matter without objection. Brian P. Lahey, M.D. (“Licensee”), appeared, *pro se*. Sebastian Orosco, Deputy Litigation Counsel, appeared on behalf of the Respondent, Disciplinary Panel #33 (“DP #33”).

**I. Summary of Proceedings**

Dr. Lahey filed a request for the Board to approve Dr. Lahey practicing part-time at a **CONFIDENTIAL** (“IP”) office location in Overland Park, Kansas. The presiding officer has been designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514(g) to conduct a hearing and issue a Final Order in this matter.

**II. Findings of Fact**

After reviewing the: agency record; testimony; evidence; statements and arguments of the parties; and being otherwise advised in the premises, the Presiding Officer makes the following findings, conclusions, and order:

1. Dr. Lahey is licensed as a medical doctor (M.D.) in the State of Kansas, having been issued active License No. 04-33861 on or about July 1, 2009.
2. On or about February 21, 2019, the Board filed an Amended Qualified Protective Order (“QPO”) to protect confidential information in this case. The Amended QPO continues in effect for the duration of this matter.
3. The hearing in this matter was closed under K.S.A. 77-523(f) for presentation of information that is confidential under K.S.A. 65-4925. Transcript (“T”), p. 16.
4. Respondent’s Exhibits 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are admitted to the agency record without objection. T, pp. 17-18.
5. Pertinent prior Board orders in this case are as follows (summary details for each order listed in paragraphs below):

April 16, 2019	2019 Consent Order. Suspended license indefinitely for violations of Kansas Healing Arts act.
June 19, 2020	2020 First Amended Consent Order. Upon reinstatement – license subject to limitations.
June 27, 2022	2022 Final Order. Changed license designation from inactive to active with limitations. Approved part-time practice at <b>CONFIDENTIAL</b> (“RHCL”).
May 13, 2024	2024 Final Order. Approved part-time practice at IP and continuation of part-time practice at RHCL.
February 25, 2025	February 2025 Final Order. Approved terminating practice at RHCL and modifications to current practice at IP Lawrence office.

6. The Board orders listed in the table above are incorporated as findings in this order as though fully set forth herein.

*2019 Consent Order*

7. On April 16, 2019, the Board issued the 2019 Consent Order in this case resolving allegations that: (1) **CONFIDENTIAL**  
(2) had an inappropriate intimate relationship with a patient; (3) entered into inappropriate financial obligations with a patient; (4) continued to treat patients after his license was emergently suspended; and (5) generally failed to set appropriate boundaries with his patients. The Consent Order **indefinitely suspended** Dr. Lahey's Kansas M.D. license with the option for Dr. Lahey to apply to the Board for reinstatement of his license at a future date. Any application for reinstatement was to be governed by the factors listed in *Vakas v. Kansas Board of Healing Arts*, 248 Kan. 589, 600, (1991). 2019 Consent Order, pp. 3-5, also included in the agency record as 2020 First Amended Consent Order, Exhibit A.

*2020 First Amended Consent Order*

8. On or about April 29, 2020, after successful completion of a 14-month, **CONFIDENTIAL** education program (March 4, 2019, to May 1, 2020), Dr. Lahey filed a motion to terminate the suspension of his M.D. license and requested to return to the practice of medicine. 2020 First Amended Consent Order, pp. 3-4.
9. On June 19, 2020, the Board issued the First Amended Consent Order requiring Dr. Lahey to agree that **upon reinstatement, his medical license would be subject to limitations** as follows:

1. Dr. Lahey may practice in an institutional setting;
2. Dr. Lahey may practice in a group practice, but shall not treat female patients;
3. Dr. Lahey shall not practice in a solo, office sharing, or similar settings;
4. **CONFIDENTIAL**
  
5. **CONFIDENTIAL**
  
6. Dr. Lahey shall have a workplace monitor to supervise his practice for a period of two years. The monitor will send quarterly reports to **CONFIDENTIAL** the Board;
7. Dr. Lahey shall maintain impeccable professional boundaries and will have no personal or social relationships with patients regardless of gender;
8. Dr. Lahey shall not treat any patients without having a patient chaperone present at all times. Any proposed patient chaperone must speak with the Board (or designated staff member) and be approved by the Board;
9. For five years the patient chaperone shall create, maintain, and submit to the Board monthly a daily log of all patients seen by Dr. Lahey;
10. Dr. Lahey shall undergo **CONFIDENTIAL** polygraph exams every six months for two years with results provided to **CONFIDENTIAL** the Board; and
11. **CONFIDENTIAL**

10. The First Amended Consent Order monitoring provisions are not self-terminating. After a period of five years, Dr. Lahey may request the Board to modify or terminate the provisions. *Id.* at p. 7.

*2022 Final Order  
Approving Dr. Lahey's Part-Time Practice at RHCL*

11. On or about June 27, 2022, the Board issued a Final Order – Approval of Patient Chaperone and Approval of Change of Designation of License (“2022 Final Order”). The 2022 Final Order approved a change in designation of Dr. Lahey’s Kansas M.D. license from inactive

to **active with limitations**. The 2022 Final Order approved: (1) Dr. Lahey’s part-time practice at RHCL; (2) the patient chaperone; (3) the worksite practice monitor; and (4) continuation of all provisions of the 2019 Consent Order and 2020 First Amended Consent Order. In regard to the worksite practice monitor, the 2022 Final Order permitted Dr. Lahey, after two years, to submit a written request to the Board to modify or terminate the worksite practice monitor requirements. 2022 Final Order, pp. 9-11.

*2024 Final Order  
Approving Dr. Lahey’s Part-Time Practice at IP*

12. On or about May 13, 2024, the Board issued a Final Order – Approval of Part-Time: Practice Site; Worksite Monitor; and Patient Chaperone (“2024 Final Order”). The 2024 Final Order approved: (1) Dr. Lahey’s proposed part-time practice at IP; (2) Anna Pfannenstiel, LSCSW, as worksite practice monitor; (3) Ethan Bickelhaupt, M.D., as clinical monitor; (4) Sean Viteri as patient chaperone; (5) continuation of his part-time practice at RHCL; and (6) continuation of all provisions of the Board’s prior Consent Orders and Orders. 2024 Final Order, pp. 3-7.

*2025 Final Order  
Approving Termination of Practice at RHCL  
and Modifications for Practice at IP Lawrence Office*

13. On or about February 25, 2025, the Board issued a Final Order – Approval of Request to Change Practice Site; Worksite Monitor; and Patient Chaperone (“February 2025 Final Order”). The February 2025 Final Order approved: (1) termination of Dr. Lahey’s part-time practice at RHCL; (2) Dr. Lahey’s request to modify his part-time practice with limitations at the IP office in Lawrence, Kansas; (3) Ruby Mae Johnson, Chief Executive Officer of IP, to serve as Dr. Lahey’s new IP worksite monitor, replacing the current IP

worksite monitor Anissa Pfannenstiel, LCSW; (4) Sean Viteri to continue as Dr. Lahey's IP patient chaperone; and (5) Ethan Bickelhaupt, M.D., to continue to serve as Dr. Lahey's IP clinical monitor. February 2025 Final Order, pp. 13-16.

*Dr. Lahey' Current Request to  
Expand Practice to IP Overland Park*

14. On or about June 11, 2025, Dr. Lahey requested the Board modify the February 2025 Final Order to permit Dr. Lahey to see patients at the IP Overland Park, Kansas office.

*DP#33 Response to  
Current Request to Expand Practice to IP Overland Park*

15. On or about July 29, 2025, DP#33 filed a Response to Dr. Lahey's request to modify the February 2025 Final Order ("July 2025 Response") stating:

1. Dr. Lahey requests Board approval to practice at the IP Overland Park, Kansas office and continue to practice at the IP Lawrence, Kansas office;
2. Dr. Lahey requests Amanda Chandy be approved to serve as Dr. Lahey's new IP worksite monitor, replacing the current IP worksite monitor Ruby Mae Johnson;
3. **CONFIDENTIAL**
4. DP#33 does not object to Dr. Lahey's current request but asks that a Presiding Officer (Board member) be appointed to review whether Dr. Lahey's request is in compliance with prior Board orders. July 2025 Response, pp. 4-5.

*Dr. Lahey's Current IP Worksite Monitor*

16. Amanda Chandy, Practice Manager at IP, testified and submitted written testimony that:

1. She has been Dr. Lahey's IP worksite monitor since June 25, 2025. Ruby Mae Johnson, former chief executive officer of IP, Dr. Lahey's former worksite monitor, is no longer employed at IP. T, pp. 25, 29, 39-40 and Exhibit 2.
2. Ms. Johnson has not been at IP since she (Ms. Chandy) started at IP, and she (Ms. Chandy) does not know the dynamics of what happened to Ms. Johnson's role at IP. T, pp. 24-25 and 29.
3. She knows Dr. Lahey from their work at IP but has no relationship with Dr. Lahey outside of the workplace and sees no conflict of interest in serving as the worksite monitor. T, pp. 32 and 38-39.
4. Dr. Lahey currently sees patients two days per week, with an average of four patients per day at the IP Lawrence office. She is familiar with Dr. Lahey's practice, patient schedule, and patient log and she is not aware of any issues with patients and Dr. Lahey. T, pp. 25-27
5. She knows Dr. Lahey's practice limitations including:
  - a. Dr. Lahey is required to have a worksite monitor, patient chaperone and clinical monitor;
  - b. Practicing in a group setting and not in a setting that is solo or office sharing;
  - c. Not engaging in personal or social relationships with patients; and
  - d. Seeing only male patients. T, pp. 26-28.

6. In her role as Dr. Lahey's worksite monitor, she:
  - a. Oversees Dr. Lahey's day-to-day work at IP;
  - b. Oversees and meets weekly with Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone;
  - c. Co-signs monthly reports submitted to the Board summarizing the weekly meetings with the patient chaperone; and
  - d. Prepares and submits quarterly reports to **CONFIDENTIAL** the Board's Compliance Coordinator. T, pp 30-31 and Exhibit 4.
7. She understands the duties and responsibilities required of Dr. Lahey's worksite monitor and agrees to serve as Dr. Lahey's worksite monitor. T, p. 32 and Exhibit 4.
8. As to the proposed practice at the IP Overland Park office, Dr. Lahey would see patients two days per week, with an average of four to five patients per day. As to continuing his practice at the IP Lawrence office, Dr. Lahey would continue to see patients two days per week, with an average of four to five patients per day. T, p. 33.
9. She travels between the IP Lawrence and Overland Park offices, can be in both locations on the same day, and if the Board approves Dr. Lahey to practice at both locations:
  - a. It doesn't pose any concerns or issues from her perspective; and
  - b. It does not impact her ability to serve as Dr. Lahey's worksite monitor.T, pp. 33-34.

*Dr. Lahey's Current IP Clinical Monitor*

17. Ethan Bickelhaupt, M.D., testified that:

1. He is an independent contractor for **CONFIDENTIAL** in Lenexa, Kansas.  
T, p. 44.
2. He is the outside clinical monitor for Dr. Lahey and part of the medical board supervision for Dr. Lahey's practice at the IP Lawrence office and knows of nothing that would create bias or conflict in serving as Dr. Lahey's clinical monitor. T, pp. 44 and 49.
3. He has served as Dr. Lahey's clinical monitor for two years and in that role he:
  1. Reviews all of Dr. Lahey's charts;
  2. Meets monthly with Dr. Lahey to discuss patient issues and communicates regularly Dr. Lahey by text regarding Dr. Lahey's patients;
  3. Prepares and submits quarterly reports to the Board's compliance coordinator; and
  4. **CONFIDENTIAL**
4. His clinical impression is that Dr. Lahey does an excellent job of blending psychotherapy into medication management and has no concerns about Dr. Lahey's clinical performance. T, pp 45-47.
5. His role as clinical monitor for Dr. Lahey's proposed practice at IP Overland Park will be identical to his current role at the IP Lawrence office. T, p. 50

6. He supports the expansion of Dr. Lahey's practice to include the IP Overland Park office and adding the Overland Park location will not impact his ability to serve as Dr. Lahey's clinical monitor. T, pp. 47-48.
7. He is willing to serve as Dr. Lahey's clinical monitor if the Board approves Dr. Lahey's proposed practice at the IP Overland Park office. T, pp. 47-48.

*Dr. Lahey's Current IP Patient Chaperone*

18. Sean Viteri testified that:

1. He is employed at IP as an accountant, is Dr. Lahey's current patient chaperone, and knows of nothing that would create bias or conflict in serving as Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone. T, pp. 52-53 and 56.
2. In his role as Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone, he is physically present and accompanies each patient seen by Dr. Lahey and produces a daily log identifying all patients seen by Dr. Lahey. T, pp. 53-54.
3. He meets weekly with Dr. Lahey's worksite monitor, prepares a monthly report of these meetings, and submits the monthly report to the Board's compliance coordinator. There have been no issues regarding Dr. Lahey's care and treatment of patients at IP. T, pp. 53-55.
4. He is willing to serve as Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone at the IP Overland Park office in addition to continuing to serve as Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone at the IP Lawrence office. T, pp. 55-56.
5. He has no concerns about Dr. Lahey expanding his practice to IP Overland Park and his additional responsibility as patient chaperone in both locations. T, pp. 55-56.

# CONFIDENTIAL

*Testimony From Dr. Lahey*

20. Dr. Lahey testified that:

1. The goal in adding the second IP location in Overland Park is to build a larger group of patients, but any increase will be gradual and probably take a year or two. In addition to limitations imposed by Board orders, Dr. Lahey's current practice is also limited by insurance companies that have credentialed him to participate in their networks. T. pp. 70-71.
2. He is grateful to the Board, feels like he has been treated very fairly, is trying to become a better human being and better provider, and would like to thank everyone that has been involved in working with him in this matter. T, pp. 71-72.

**III. Conclusions of Law**

K.S.A. 65-2801 states the purpose of the Board and the healing arts act is to properly protect the public against unprofessional, improper, unauthorized, and unqualified practice of the healing arts and from unprofessional conduct by persons licensed to practice under this act.

K.S.A. 65-2836 provides that a licensee's license may be revoked, suspended, or limited, or the licensee may be publicly censured or placed under probationary conditions if the licensee has violated any of the 31 provisions listed in the statute.

#### IV. Order

##### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED

###### *Continuing Limitations*

1. The following limitations on Dr. Lahey's Kansas physician license stated in the June 19, 2020, First Amended Consent Order continue:

1. Dr. Lahey may practice in an institutional setting;
2. Dr. Lahey may practice in a group practice, but shall not see or treat female patients;
3. Dr. Lahey shall not practice in a solo, office sharing, or similar settings;
4. **CONFIDENTIAL**
5. **CONFIDENTIAL**
6. Dr. Lahey shall have a workplace monitor to supervise his practice for a period of two years. The monitor will send quarterly reports to **CONFIDENTIAL** the Board;
7. Dr. Lahey shall maintain impeccable professional boundaries and will have no personal or social relationships with patients regardless of gender;
8. Dr. Lahey shall not treat any patients without having a patient chaperone present at all times. Any proposed patient chaperone must speak with the Board (or designated staff member) and be approved by the Board;
9. For five years the patient chaperone shall create, maintain, and submit to the Board a daily log of all patients seen by Dr. Lahey;
10. **CONFIDENTIAL**
11. The First Amended Consent Order monitoring provisions are not self-terminating. After a period of five years, Dr. Lahey may request the Board to modify or terminate the provisions.

*Motion Granted*

2. Dr. Lahey's request for Board approval to practice part-time at the IP office in Overland Park, Kansas in addition to Dr. Lahey continuing to practice part-time in the IP Office in Lawrence, Kansas is **GRANTED** as follows.

*Future Modification of Board Orders*

3. The Presiding Officer notes that: (1) Dr. Lahey requested modification of the February 2025 Final Order on June 11, 2025; (2) Ms. Chandy replaced Ms. Johnson on June 25, 2025; and (3) the hearing to consider Dr. Lahey's request was held on December 1, 2025.
4. This Final Order, as well as prior Board orders, require **PRIOR** Board approval for:
  - Any change in the personal involvement or level of participation of the worksite practice monitor, clinical monitor, or patient chaperone; or
  - Any change in: (i) number of patients seen per day; (ii) number of days working per week; (iii) practice at locations; or (iv) using telemedicine.
5. Future requests for modification or amendment of Board orders shall obtain approval of the Board **PRIOR** to the change occurring in Dr. Lahey's practice.

*Approval of IP Worksite Practice Monitor*

7. Subject to the provisions of this Final Order, prior Board orders, and continuing limitations on Dr. Lahey's Kansas physician license, the following individuals are **APPROVED** by the Board to function in the roles designated below at both the IP Lawrence, Kansas and IP Overland Park, Kansas offices related to Dr. Lahey's part-time practice at IP:
  1. Amanda Chandy, practice manager at IP, shall replace Ruby Mae Johnson, as the new IP worksite practice monitor, effective June 25, 2025. In the role of Dr. Lahey's IP worksite practice monitor, Ms. Chandy shall complete tasks as follows:
    1. Oversee the day-to-day work that Dr. Lahey performs; oversee the patient chaperone; collaborate with all necessary parties; and report to the Board as required;
    2. Meet weekly with Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone and sign the written monthly summary report of these weekly meetings. The monthly summary report shall be prepared by the patient chaperone, signed by the patient chaperone and worksite monitor, and filed with the Board's Compliance Coordinator by the patient chaperone;
    3. The worksite monitor (Ms. Chandy) shall prepare and submit quarterly written reports to **CONFIDENTIAL** the Board's Compliance Coordinator summarizing Dr. Lahey's practice at IP and citing any concerns or issues; and
    4. Complete all other worksite monitor tasks as required by this Final Order or prior Board orders.

*Approval of IP Clinical Monitor*

2. Ethan Bickelhaupt, M.D., will continue as Dr. Lahey's IP clinical monitor. In the role of Dr. Lahey's IP clinical monitor, Dr. Bickelhaupt shall complete tasks as follows;

1. Review all of Dr. Lahey's charts and meet with Dr. Lahey at least once per month to discuss patient issues;
2. The clinical monitor shall prepare and submit quarterly written reports to the Board's Compliance Coordinator summarizing Dr. Lahey's practice at IP and citing any concerns or issues; and
3. Complete all other clinical monitor tasks as required by this Final Order or prior Board orders.

*Approval of IP Patient Chaperone*

3. Sean Viteri will continue as IP patient chaperone. In the role of Dr. Lahey's patient chaperone, Mr. Viteri shall complete tasks as follows:

1. The patient chaperone shall (i) accompany each patient seen by Dr. Lahey; and (ii) be physically present in the room through the duration of the entire patient visit – at no time and under no circumstance will Dr. Lahey be alone with a patient. The patient chaperone shall be situated in the room in such a manner that he is able to directly observe and hear all interactions between Dr. Lahey and his patient;
2. Meet weekly with Amanda Chandy, (Dr. Lahey's worksite practice monitor) about the care that Dr. Lahey's patients are receiving;
3. Shall submit the monthly reports listed below to the Board's Compliance Coordinator to be received on or before the 15th day of the following month:
  - a. a daily log (created and maintained by the patient chaperone) identifying by a numbering system that can be correlated to the IP patient identity of all patients seen by Dr. Lahey that day; and

- b. a summary report of the weekly meetings between Sean Viteri and Amanda Chandy (worksite practice monitor) evaluating Dr. Lahey's care and treatment of patients at IP. This summary report is to be signed by both Amanda Chandy and Sean Viteri.

*Change in Practice or Participation of  
Current IP Monitoring Personnel*

8. Any change of Dr. Lahey's practice or in the personal involvement or level of participation of: (1) Sean Viteri as IP patient chaperone; (2) Amanda Chandy, as IP worksite practice monitor; or (3) Ethan Bickelhaupt, M.D., as IP clinical monitor, shall receive approval in writing from the Board **PRIOR** to the change occurring in Dr. Lahey's practice.

*Limitations on Dr. Lahey's Practice at IP*

9. Dr. Lahey' practice under this order is further **LIMITED** as follows: (1) Dr. Lahey is limited to seeing a maximum of five male patients per day for in-person psychiatric visits at the IP Lawrence, Kansas office; (2) Dr. Lahey is limited to practicing two days per week at the IP Lawrence, Kansas office; (3) Dr. Lahey is limited to seeing a maximum of five male patients per day for in-person psychiatric visits at the IP Overland Park, Kansas office; (4) Dr. Lahey is limited to practicing two days per week at the IP Overland Park, Kansas office; and (5) Dr. Lahey is not permitted to see patients using telemedicine.
10. Any change in: (1) number of patients seen per day; (2) number of days working per week; (3) practice at locations; or (4) using telemedicine shall be reviewed and determined by the Board **PRIOR** to the change occurring in Dr. Lahey's practice.

11. Dr. Lahey's active license is limited to practicing in strict compliance with the above-described IP practice locations and IP psychiatric patient population.

*Future Requests for Modification and the Disciplinary Panel*

12. A future request to modify: (1) the number of patients Dr. Lahey sees per day in his practice at IP; (2) the number of days Dr. Lahey works per week in his practice at IP; or (3) both; shall be determined by the then current DP. Upon the request of either the DP or Dr. Lahey, the proposal may be considered instead by the Board.

13. Subject to the exception stated in Item 12 above (modification of number of IP patients seen per day or days worked per week at IP), all requests for modification or termination of any practice limitation on Dr. Lahey's license shall be considered and determined by the Board.

*Prior Board Orders Remain in Effect*

Unless specifically modified by the provisions of this Final Order, all provisions of the Board's prior Consent Orders and Orders **remain and continue in full effect**.
