CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW, Petitioner, Disciplinary Panel #38 ("Petitioner"), a duly authorized committee of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), by and through C. Sebastian Thomas Orosco, Deputy Litigation Counsel, and Reginald J. Jones, O.T.A. ("Licensee"), *pro se*, and moves the Board for approval of a Consent Order affecting Licensee's license to practice as an occupational therapy assistant in the State of Kansas. The Parties stipulate and agree to the following:

1. Licensee's last known mailing address to the Board is: **CONFIDENTIAL**

2. On or about December 15, 2010, Licensee was issued an active license to practice as an occupational therapy assistant in Kansas, having been issued License No. 18-00749. Licensee's license is Active, having last renewed on March 5, 2025.

3. The Board is the sole and exclusive administrative agency in the state of Kansas authorized to regulate practice of occupational therapy assistants, K.S.A. 65-5401 *et seq.*

4. The terms and conditions of the Consent Order are entered into between the undersigned parties and are submitted for the purpose of allowing these terms and conditions to become an Order of the Board. This Consent Order shall not be binding on the Board until an

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authorized signature is affixed at the end of this document. Licensee specifically acknowledges that counsel for the Board is not authorized to sign this Consent Order on behalf of the Board.

5. A protective order is hereby entered to protect all confidential information under K.S.A. 65-2898a.

6. The parties agree and stipulate to the factual basis for this Consent Order as follows:

- a. On or about August 30, 2021, a complaint was filed with Licensee's employer after Licensee, while engaged in the practice as an Occupational Therapy Assistant, accessed a patient's medical records to obtain said patient's personal phone number for the purpose of establishing a romantic relationship. After investigation, the claim was substantiated, and Licensee received a three-day work suspension as a sanction for violating HIPAA privacy laws. (Bd. Ex. 1 **CONFIDENTIAL**)

d. To date, Licensee has attempted but has not successfully passed the Boundary, Unprofessional Conduct, and Professional Standards modules provided by EBAS. (Bd. Ex. 2 – Email and ^{CONFIDENTIAL} from EBAS December 4, 2024).

7. The Board has received information and investigated the same and has reason to believe there are grounds to take action with respect to Licensee’s license under the Occupational Therapy Practice Act. Specifically,

- a. K.S.A. 65-5410(a)(4) in that Licensee violated a lawful order or directive of the Board by failing to successfully complete the Boundary, Unprofessional Conduct, and Professional Standards modules offered by EBAS by October 23, 2024; and
- b. K.S.A. 65-5410(a)(2) in that Licensee committed an act of unprofessional conduct, as further defined by K.A.R. 100-54-5(h) by being sanctioned or disciplined by a peer review committee or medical care facility for acts or conduct that would constitute grounds for denial, refusal to renew, suspension, or revocation of a license under K.S.A. 65-5410.

8. Under K.S.A. 65-5410, the Board may revoke, suspend or limit a license, or may publicly or privately censure a licensee upon finding that Licensee has violated the Occupational Therapy Practice Act.

9. Licensee admits that he has violated the Occupational Therapy Practice Act with respect to the above allegations. Licensee further waives his right to dispute or otherwise contest the allegations contained in the above paragraphs in any further proceeding before the Board.

10. This Consent Order and the filing of such document are in accordance with applicable law, and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into the Consent Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-505 and K.S.A. 65-2838. Upon approval, these stipulations shall constitute the findings of the Board, and this Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Final Order.

11. The Occupational Therapy Practice Act is constitutional on its face and as applied in the case. Licensee agrees that, in considering this matter, the Board is not acting beyond its jurisdiction as provided by law.

12. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to a hearing, to present a defense by oral testimony and documentary evidence, to submit rebuttal evidence, and to conduct cross-examination of witnesses. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly agrees to waive all possible substantive and procedural motions and defenses that could be raised if an administrative hearing were held.

13. Under to K.S.A. 65-2838(b) and K.S.A. 77-505, the Board has authority to enter into this Consent Order without the necessity of proceeding to a formal hearing.

14. All the materials in **CONFIDENTIAL** regarding Licensee were fully reviewed and considered by the Board members who serve on the Board's Disciplinary Panel. Disciplinary Panel No. 38 authorized and directed Board counsel to seek settlement of this matter with the provisions contained in this Consent Order.

15. Licensee further understands and agrees that if the Board finds, after due written notice and an opportunity for a hearing, that Licensee has failed to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, the Board may immediately impose any sanction provided for by law, including but not limited to suspension or revocation of Licensee's license to practice as an

occupational therapist assistant in Kansas. Licensee hereby expressly understands and agrees that, at any such hearing, the sole issue shall be whether or not Licensee has failed to comply with any of the terms or conditions set forth in this Consent Order. The Board acknowledges that at any such hearing, Licensee retains the right to confront and examine all witnesses, present evidence, testify on his own behalf, contest the allegations, present oral argument, appeal to the courts, and all other rights set forth in the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, and the Kansas Occupational Therapy Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-5401 *et seq.*

16. Nothing in this Consent Order shall be construed to deny the Board jurisdiction to investigate alleged violations of the Occupational Therapy Practice Act, or to investigate complaints received under the Risk Management Law, K.S.A. 65-4921 *et seq.*, that are known or unknown and are not covered under this Consent Order, or to initiate formal proceedings based upon known or unknown allegations of violations of the Kansas Occupational Therapy Practice Act.

17. Licensee hereby releases the Board, its individual members (in their official and personal capacity), attorneys, employees and agents, hereinafter collectively referred to as "Releasees", from any and all claims, including but not limited to those alleged damages, actions, liabilities, both administrative and civil, including the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.* arising out of the investigation and acts leading to the execution of this Consent Order. This release shall forever discharge the Releasees of any and all claims or demands of every kind and nature that Licensee has claimed to have had at the time of this release or might have had, either known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and Licensee shall not commence to prosecute, cause or permit to be prosecuted, any action or proceeding of any description against the Releasees.

18. Licensee further understands and agrees that upon signature by Licensee, this document shall be deemed a public record and shall be reported to any entities authorized to receive disclosure of the Consent Order.

19. This Consent Order, when signed by both parties, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may only be modified or amended by a subsequent document executed in the same manner by the parties.

20. Licensee agrees that all information maintained by the Board pertaining to the nature and result of any complaint and/or investigation may be fully disclosed to and considered by the Board in conjunction with the presentation of any offer of settlement, even if Licensee is not present. Licensee further acknowledges that the Board may conduct further inquiry as it deems necessary before acceptance of any offer of settlement.

21. Licensee, by signature to this document, waives any objection to the participation of the Board members, including the Disciplinary Panel and General Counsel, in the consideration of this offer of settlement and agrees not to seek the disqualification or recusal of any Board member or General Counsel in any future proceedings on the basis that the Board member or General Counsel has received investigative information from any source which otherwise may not be admissible or admitted as evidence.

22. Licensee acknowledges he has read this Consent Order, fully understands its contents, and it has been entered into freely and voluntarily.

23. Licensee shall obey all federal, state, and local laws and rules governing the practice of occupational therapy assistants in Kansas that may be in place at the time of execution of the Consent Order or may become effective subsequent to the execution of this document.

24. Upon execution of this Consent Order by affixing a Board authorized signature below, the provisions of this Consent Order shall become a Final Order and shall constitute the Board's Order when filed with the office of the Executive Director for the Board and no further Order is required.

25. This Consent Order constitutes **public disciplinary action**.

26. The Board may consider all aspects of this Consent Order in any future matter regarding Licensee.

27. In lieu of conducting a formal proceeding, Licensee, by signature affixed to this Consent Order, hereby voluntarily agrees to the following disciplinary action against his license to engage in practice as an occupational therapy assistant in Kansas.

PUBLIC CENSURE

28. Licensee is hereby **PUBLICLY CENSURED**.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Consent Order and agreement of the parties contained herein is adopted by the Board as findings of fact, conclusions of law, and as a Final Order of the Board.


